Dear Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge on behalf of His Excellency the President of the Republic Sheikh Professor Alhaji Dr. Yahya A J J Jammeh, receipt of your long letter dated 3rd May 2013, through which you expressed to him your shock and dismay at the way you are being treated, among other things.

On the onset, and in reacting to your missive, I wish to convey our deepest gratitude to the Almighty Allah for causing you to show in your own handwriting how greedy, dishonest and ungrateful you are by sending us this stupid and legally suicidal correspondence.

Having cited the numerous projects that have been awarded to you and paid for, even though there were other bidders, it begs the question as to who should be grateful to who? You have been given special treatment and all the other privileges you can think of but because of greed, you want it all and now it has been decided that you will no longer enjoy the IDB

facility you are setting your eyes on. Furthermore, if by the 13th of May, 2013 there is no fuel as threatened, you may as well turn yourself into HFO and be used to generate power, as this tantamount to blackmail which is a serious crime on the basis of your letter. In any International Court of Law, you can easily be fried without oil since your rude and arrogant letter is full of thinly-veiled threats that only a stupid, ungrateful and dishonest person, blinded by sheer greed would put in writing and address it to a Head of State.

As a consequence, you will be taken to task for a variety of reasons that will cost you dearly. As a first step, you should keep your dirty hands off GAMICO, a company you have benefitted from without any accountability. As for Gampetroleum, Gambian Institutions are shareholders and you have not even presented any accounts not to mention paying dividends to shareholders since start of the operations.

As from now, there will be a proper management team representing all the shareholders and a Board that would represent all shareholders. There will be an international audit company to audit Gampetroleum's financial activities since beginning of operations about five years ago. Additionally, all dividends payments due to shareholders must be paid for upfront at the end of the audit.

Furthermore, please be informed that you will no longer enjoy any new contract with Gambia Government and the one currently with NAWEC will be cancelled.

Following all the claims you made in your letter, you are hereby being given up to 8th May 2013 to back them up with original documents confirming your claims or else face criminal proceedings for lying and giving false information. Your own writing has definitely and legally nailed your own coffin.

You need to also provide all the financial statements of minerals exported by GAMICO and full details of tonnage and payments made by the purchasers in China including Bank Transfer Statements since you started operations. You are given up to 8th May, 2013 as well to provide them, failure to do so, be prepared for a full-fledged criminal investigation that would involve International Companies that specialise in Mining Fraud investigations concerning fraudulent mining exports from Africa. A US Company that specialises in China – Africa mineral exploitation and exports to China will be used, amongst a host of other competent companies.

You also made mention of a Refinery Project in The Gambia dependent on you maintaining the monopoly on fuel importation. This monopoly will be no more and you may therefore take the project to Lebanon or anywhere of your choice.

Please be informed that as from now on, you will be treated like any investor except that you will be held to stricter accountability as you have proven to be very greedy, dishonest, ungrateful and treacherous.

Whilst awaiting documentary proof of your claims, failure of which we will see you in court, I hope that this matter will be treated with the urgency and seriousness it deserves.
