EVIDENCE OF MOMODOU O.S. BADJIE FORMER MANAGING DIRECTOR OF GNPC

- 1. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: I call on Mr. Momodou O.S. Badjie Former Managing Director of
- 2. GNPC (Gambia National Petroleum Company Limited).
- 3. Q: Can you give your full names to the Commission?
- 4. A: My name is Momodou O.S. Badjie.
- 5. Q: What does the O.S. stand for?
- 6. A: Ousman and Saruba.
- 7. Q: Where do you live?
- 8. A: I live in Kanifing Estate at D13.
- 9. Q: What work do you do?
- 10. A: I was the Managing Director of **Gambia National Petroleum Cooperation (GNPC)**
- 11. from January 2008 to June 19th 2016.
- 12. Q: What do you do now?
- 13. A: I was reinstated at **GNPC** but redeployed to **AMRC** as the Head of Finance.
- 14. Q: You said that you were Managing Director of the Gambia National Petroleum
- 15. **Company (GNPC)** from what period?
- 16. A: From January 2008 to June 19th 2016 when I was arrested and detained.
- 17. Q: Did you go back to **GNPC**?
- 18. A: Yes, I came back in June again 2017 and end of July 2017 I was redeployed to **AMRC.**
- 19. Q: Before you were Managing Director did you work in any other capacity at **GNPC**?
- 20. A: No, I came in as Acting Managing Director in 2008.
- 21. Q: Where were, you working before?
- 22. A: I worked at various places, I was Director of Finance at the **NRA** before coming to
- 23. **GNPC.**
- 24. **Q**: What is **NRA**?

- 25. A: National Roads Authority.
- 26. Q: Before that did you work in the Public Service?
- 27. A: I worked with **GAMTEL** and also **IBC**.
- 28. Q: You worked with **GAMTEL** during what period?
- 29. A: February 1991 to December 1998.
- 30. Q: In what capacity?
- 31. A: My last position was Senior Internal Auditor.
- 32. Q: Did you work in any other area in the public service other than **GAMTEL** and **NRA**?
- 33. A: Not in the Public Service but the private sector.
- 34. Q: We are only interested in your Public Service. What is **GNPC** (Gambia National
- 35. Petroleum Company Ltd)?
- 36. A: It was a limited company before but after it was changed to Cooperation in 2014 when
- 37. the Act was passed.
- 38. Q: It is a Public Enterprise?
- 39. A: Yes.
- 40. Q: Wholly owned by the government and the public institutions?
- 41. A: No, wholly owned by government.
- 42. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: At some staged.
- 43. Q: I will show you this document which purports to be a Memorandum and
- 44. Article of association of **GNPC**; can you confirm that it is?
- 45. (Document shown to the witness).
- 46. A: Yes, I saw this document but this never took off.
- 47. Q: Was it registered as a Company before it became a Cooperation?
- 48. A: Yes, it was registered as a Company but the companies here never contributed anything.
- 49. Q: It was registered with them as Shareholders but they never contributed anything?
- 50. A: Yes.

- 51. Q: Is that a copy of what was registered?
- 52. A: Yes.
- 53. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: I am applying to have it admitted.
- 54. THE CHAIRMAN: Memorandum and Articles of incorporation of **Gambia National**
- 55. **Petroleum Company Ltd (GNPC)** dated 11th June, 2003 admitted and marked **SC1**.
- 56. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: Mr. Chairman what does **S** and **C** stands for?
- 57. THE CHAIRMAN: It is a notation for **State Cooperation.**
- 58. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: Thank you.
- 59. Q: Mr. Badjie this Commission is inquiring into the application of resources from Public
- 60. institutions with the involvement of the former government under Ex-President Jammeh. During
- 61. the period you served as head of **GNPC** was there any involvement whether directly or
- 62. indirectly by Ex-President Jammeh in the application of your resources?
- 63. A: Yes, we had directives.
- 64. Q: Can you tell us about the directives?
- 65. A: When I came in, I took over some liabilities which were from the government institutions
- 66. like PEGEP, Kanilai Family Farms, Jammeh Foundations and Office of the President. They
- 67. were loans given to them which actually are outstanding in our books.
- 68. Q: Can you take them one by one and tell us what these loans were, these are legacy issues
- 69. and you took them over?
- 70. A: Yes, I took these ones over. There was one for October 2006 which was US\$45, 300
- 71. (Forty-Five Thousand Three Hundred Dollars) to **PEGEP**.
- 72. O: For who?
- 73. A: It was for **PEGEP**.
- 74. Q: What does **PEGEP** stand for?
- 75. A: I forget.
- 76. Q: Is it different from the President's empowerment something?

- 77. A: Yes, it is the President's Empowerment for Girls Education Project (PEGEP)
- 78. Q: So, there was a loan of **US\$45, 000** outstanding?
- 79. A: Yes.
- 80. Q: What documents were you looking at?
- 81. A: I am looking at the document dated October 2006 **Ref: GP001OA-171006-01**.
- 82. Q: Is it a letter?
- 83. A: Yes, that is the letter which was written to the Bank for the transfer.
- 84. Q: Which bank?
- 85. A: Trust bank.
- 86. Q: Give us details Mr. Badjie to transfer what?
- 87. A: To transfer **US\$45, 300** to **PEGEP** and the account number for **PEGEP** is **12010747401**.
- 88. Q: Can you hand over the documents to the Commission. You can go through your
- 89. documents but when you finish with it just hand it over to the gentleman.
- 90. A: The other one was also to **PEGEP** payment of cash **US\$1,000,000** (**One Million**
- 91. **US Dollars**).
- 92. O: What date and which bank?
- 93. A: 25th of October 2006.
- 94. Q: What is the document you are looking at?
- 95. A: It is a letter dated 25th October 2006 and the reference is **GP001OA25100601**
- 96. addressed to **Trust Bank** and this was cash payment.
- 97. Q: Cash payment to whom?
- 98. A: It was received by one **Omar Gibba** but for **PEGEP**.
- 99. Q: Omar Gibba was working where?
- 100. A: He was working at the Office of the President.
- 101. Q: Do you know in which capacity he was working?
- 102. A: I don't know exactly but at one time he was the Chief of Protocol or Assistant Chief of

- 103. Protocol, something like that.
- 104. Q: From which Bank Account was the amount paid?
- 105. A: This was **Trust Bank.**
- 106. Q: What was the date of received?
- 107. A: 25th of October 2006. There was also another loan to Office of the President for **US\$20**,
- 108. **000** (Twenty Thousand Dollars).
- 109. Q: What document do you have for this?
- 110. A: I am reading the letter from Office of the President to the Managing Direction **Gambia**
- 111. **National Petroleum Cooperation**, it was signed by O. Jammeh, I think it is Ousman Jammeh the
- 112. then Secretary General.
- 113. Q: Was the loan given?
- 114. A: Yes, it was given.
- 115. Q: From which bank?
- 116. A: Trust Bank.
- 117. Q: What was the date?
- 118. A: The letter was dated 12th December 2006 and the reference is **GP001OA121206O1**
- 119. Q: Can you hand over the document so that we can get to the next one?
- 120. (document handed over)
- 121. A: There was also a loan to the Office of the President for US\$303, 000 (Three Hundred
- 122. and Three Thousand USDollars).
- 123. Q: To be paid to whom?
- 124. A: This was to be paid to **HOBO Entertainment.**
- 125. Q: Where?
- 126. A: Is Calabasas, California.
- 127. Q: To what account number?
- 128. A: The account number is **3879861916**.

129. What bank? Q: 130. A: Wellsfargo Bank. 131. What address? Q: 132. A: It is also Calabasas, California. 133. Q: Do you know what the purpose was? 134. A: No, I don't know. 135. Q: But the loan was given? 136. A: Yes. 137. And the money was transferred to this accounts, **US\$303, 000**? Q: 138. A: Yes, and in April 2012, there was a request for a loan for the Rehabilitation of Prisons. 139. Q: Where was it paid? 140. A: It was paid to the Secretary General, Office of the President. 141. Which Secretary General? Q: 142. A: Njogu. L. Bah 143. How much? Q: 144. A: **D10, 000, 000.00** (Ten Million Dalasis). 145. Q: Into which account was it paid? 146. A: This was by cheque but I don't have the attachment here. 147. Q: You will have to check it. What is the date? The letter from the Office of the President was dated 5th of April, 2012. 148. A: 149. Q: Can you hand it over? This was after you had taken office? 150. A: Yes, it was during my time. Can you have over the document? Is that all you have up to 2010? 151. Q: 152. A: Yes, that is what we have for 2010.

Do you have a transaction relating to Air tickets?

No, I do not have those.

- 155. Q: During the period that you were there apart from these **D10**, **000**, **000**.00 loan for Prison
- 156. renovation, was there any other directives?
- 157. A: Yes.
- 158. Q: Going back to the prison renovation do you know whether the money was spent on the
- 159. Prisons?
- 160. A: No, I do not know.
- 161. Q: Do you know who was the Director of Prisons at that time?
- 162. A: I can't remember.
- 163. Q: Did you deal with the Prisons at all in respect of this money?
- 164. A: No, we just drew the cheque and gave it to the Secretary General, that is all we did.
- 165. Q: Let's move on to the other Directives you said you received?
- 166. A: Around the 6th of August, 2013 we received a directive to pay to the Office of the
- 167. President a sum of **US\$500, 000.00** (Five Hundred Thousand Dollars) but in two **US\$250,**
- 168. **000.00** (Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars) in cash and the other one equivalent in Dalasi.
- 169. The payment was US\$243, 243.25 (Two Hundred and Forty-Three Thousand Two Hundred and
- 170. Forty-Three and Twenty-Five) and was converted to Dalasi was paid to the Office of the
- 171. President. It was handed over to the Secretary General by then Mr. Sabally.
- 172. Q: Mr. Momodou Sabally?
- 173. A: Yes.
- 174. Q: From which bank was this paid?
- 175. A: The US\$243, 243.25 was from Skye Bank and the withdrawal of cash of US\$150, 000
- 176. also, **Skye Bank** and **US\$100,000** form **Access Bank** making it **US\$250,000.00** was withdrawn
- 177. and given to the Secretary General then Mr. Sabally.
- 178. MRS A. BENSOUDA: Can we have the Bank Statements Skye Bank that was tendered this
- 179. morning, **BB48** to **52.** Can I have them I don't need the Bank Statement for the dalasi account just
- 180. the dollar account. The **US\$243**, **243.25** should reflect in the **Skye Bank** account?

- 181. A: Yes, the **Skye Bank** Dollar account but it was converted to dalasi which was around **D9**,
- 182. **000, 000 (Nine Million)**.
- 183. Q: When it was converted was it paid into any account?
- 184. A: No, the cash was taken to the Office of the President.
- 185. Q: Who withdrew the cash?
- 186. A: The name on the letter is Medoune but I signed it with Medoune.
- 187. Q: What is Medoune second name?
- 188. A: Medoune Sanyang.
- 189. Q: Who took it to the Office of the President?
- 190. A: Myself and Medoune.
- 191. Q: You went together to the office of the president?
- 192. A: Yes.
- 193. Q: And who did you hand the money over to?
- 194. A: We handed over the money to the Secretary General Momodou Sabally and Nuha
- 195. Touray.
- 196. Q: Nuha Touray?
- 197. A: Yes, they were who the present confirm.
- 198. Q: Did they issue a receipt for it?
- 199. A: That was the Accountant's responsibility but they signed for it.
- 200. Q: Do you have the document that they signed here?
- 201. A: No, I do not have it.
- 202. O: Should it be in the office at **GNPC**?
- 203. A: It should be there but as we were not in the office for almost a year and they have moved
- 204. offices. We had some problems when I went back to find some document so I don't know
- 205. whether it will be available.
- 206. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: Can you give this document to the witness.

- 207. Q: What date was the transaction of the US\$243, 243. 25?
- 208. A: On the 7th of August 2013.
- 209. Q: Can you look at **BB52** and identify the transaction?
- 210. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: You are highlighting it?
- 211. A: Yes, the two transaction.
- 212. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: You can highlight it, but can you just hold onto that on the side and hand
- 213. over the document that you were referring to on the US\$243, 243. Now let us go on to the next
- 214. transaction but you can keep exhibit **BB52** beside you so that if you need to identify any
- 215. transactions you can do it.
- 216. (Document handed over to the witness)
- 217. A: This is **US\$150,000** and the **US\$243,243** also has already been identify.
- 218. Q: Was that the only directive you received?
- 219. A: Yes, for these transactions and the **US\$150,000** on the **Access Account.**
- 220. Q: And that was it, you never received any other directives from the Office of the President?
- 221. A: The next thing we received was change of signature.
- 222. Q: Can you tell us about it, what happened?
- 223. A: We once wrote to the office of the President to request for the funds that we received i.e.
- 224. the **Rentals**, the **Bonus** and the **Sale of Data** to give us approvals for us to recognized it as a
- 225. Grant but what came out was they decided that they have to take over everything from us and
- 226. asked us to, in fact before that I was asked to write a comprehensive statement of all monies
- 227. collected from 2010 to date.
- 228. Q: Who asked you to write?
- 229. A: The Office of the President.
- 230. Q: They wrote to you?
- 231. A: Yes, they wrote to us.
- 232. Q: What is the date of that letter?

- 233. A: The letter was dated 30th July 2013.
- 234. Q: And what do they want, can you repeat what you said?
- 235. A: The letter was saying; "Your letter reference GNPC 101230713/118 of 23rd July 2013.
- 236. The above caption was brought to the attention of His Excellency the President of the Republic
- 237. who has noted its concern. However, His Excellency has directed that you provide a
- 238. comprehensive statement of Account of all monies collected before 16:00hrs Wednesday 31st
- 239. July 2013 without fail. Furthermore, all payments made by Oil Companies from 2010 to date
- 240. must also be accounted for without fail. All such funds should be transferred from GNPC
- 241. Account to MOP Account at the Central Bank details of the Account will submitted to you
- 242. *soon.*"
- 243. Q: The letter that is quoted, which is from you dated 23rd July 2013, do you have it there?
- 244. A: Yes.
- 245. Q: What were you asking for in that letter of 23rd July?
- 246. A: The one we wrote for ourselves was asking for them to allow us recognizes this as a
- 247. Grant to all the funds that we received.
- 248. Q: From the different Oil Companies?
- 249. A: Yes, from the Oil Companies.
- 250. Q: Can you explain what funds **GNPC** receives from Oil Companies?
- 251. A: **GNPC** receive Rentals that is surface rentals on yearly basis. Each licensee would have
- 252. to pay a Rental fee for the area that they have licensed.
- 253. Q: You issued licenses to prospecting Oil Companies?
- 254. A: Yes.
- 255. Q: Those who want to prospect for Oil in the Gambia?
- 256. A: Yes, in the Gambia.
- 257. Q: So, the licenses specifies that they have to pay surface rental?
- 258. A: Yes, they specify that-- depending in what was negotiated and agreed that they have to

- 259. pay surface rental on a yearly basis. It is from this funds that we --
- 260. Q: Only surface rental?
- 261. A: Surface rentals and also sale of data, the data is the **Size-Mic data** that is processed,
- 262. which the Oil Companies would buy. We had a data that is owned by Gambia at one time and this
- 263. data whenever a Company wants to buy they have to paid a certain amount to be able to access
- 264. that data. The other one is **Multi-Client** where companies would come to the country and would
- ask the **Ministry** that they want to do **Size-Mic** and without any cost to the Gambian government.
- 266. When they do the **Size-Mic** and they are selling the data we will have a percentage of that
- 267. revenue until they recover the cost. When they recover the cost, government would have more.
- 268. In the beginning, most of the time is 20/80 but when they recover, it becomes 60/40 or 80/20 for
- 269. the government that is sale of data and also **Bonus**. When the government negotiates any license
- 270. before the license is sign they will ask for a **Bonus**, the bonus depends on what was agreed
- 271. during the negotiation. Some would go up to, I think one of them went up to **5million** that is
- 272. **Africa Petroleum** --- before but some of them less than **5million**, depending on what you
- 273. negotiate.
- 274. Q: So as at the date of this letter the Company had received by way of revenue all these
- 275. lines of revenue?
- 276. A: On a yearly basis, we receive the Rentals and the Data sales is as per when it is sold.
- 277. Q: When you wrote that letter what did you want? Where did you lodged these monies that
- 278. You received yearly?
- 279. A: We had Accounts anyway not one Accounts, we have Accounts with most of the Banks,
- 280. Trust Bank, Standard Chartered Bank, Skye Bank also Access Bank and GT Bank. So, we
- 281. Will decide into with Account it goes depending on what agreement we have with the Bank
- 282. Because it was on a Business basis.
- 283. Q: So, when you wrote the letter of 23rd July 2013, what did you actually want for the
- 284. President to approve?

- 285. A: What we wanted is we are looking for at least something to save us from **Tax** element
- 286. And we wanted it to be treated as a Grant not as a revenue for us because the monies is for
- 287. Government but government allowed us to used it. We wanted it to be treated as a Grant so that
- 288. We will not be taxed that was the idea but unfortunately it turned otherwise.
- 289. Q: So, you wrote that letter?
- 290. A: Yes.
- 291. Q: And you got the reply that you should account for everything?
- 292. A: Yes.
- 293. Q: So what happened after that?
- 294. A: We accounted for everything that we did including the stations that we built.
- 295. Q: How many stations did you build?
- 296. A: We built Nine (9) stations from 2009 to 2013 across the Country.
- 297. Q: Nine (9) Filling Stations?
- 298. A: Yes. The **Petroleum House** was funded also from these funds and also from the
- 299. Investments that we have.
- 300. O: The **Petroleum House** at Brusubi?
- 301. A: Yes.
- 302. O: **GNPC** built it from its own resources?
- 303. A: Yes, we built it from these resources that we were managing.
- 304. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: We will come back to your investments on this.
- 305. Q: Then what happened did you accounted to the Office of the President do you have the
- 306. letters you wrote in reply?
- 307. A: Yes, we have the letter were we stated a comprehensive list of what we have done and
- 308. also a breakdown of all the **revenues** that we received after Petroleum and Oranto and Camac
- 309. also on data sales which totaled to about 16, 531,001. 79 (Sixteen Million, Five Hundred and
- 310. Thirty-One Thousand and One and Seventy-Nine).

- 311. Q: US Dollars?
- 312. A: Yes.
- 313. Q: From 2010 to 2013.
- 314. Q: As at the date of the letter did you have any cash balances?
- 315. A: Yes.
- 316. O: How much was it?
- 317. A: After the construction works and other things we had a US\$ accounts in **Trust Bank** we
- 318. had about \$341, 265.18 (Three Hundred and Forty-One Thousand, Two Hundred and Sixty-
- 319. Five Dollars and Eighteen Cents); Standard Chartered we had \$11, 537. 14 (Eleven Thousand
- 320. Five Hundred and Thirty-Seven Dollars and Fourteen Cents); Guaranty Trust Bank we had \$1,
- 321. 348, 631. 88 (One Million, Three Hundred and Forty-Eight Thousand, Six Hundred and
- 322. Thirty-One Dollars and Eighty-Eight Cents); **Skye Bank** we had \$5, 259, 053.78 (Five Million
- 323. Two Hundred and Fifty-Nine Thousand, Fifty-Three Dollars and Seventy-Eight Cents) -
- 324. Q: These are dollars?
- 325. A: Yes, these are all dollars. And Access Bank we have our \$419, 226.95 (Four Hundred
- 326. and Nineteen Thousand, Two Hundred and Twenty-Six Dollars and Ninety-Five Cents) which
- 327. total to \$7,379, 714.93 (Seven Million, Three Hundred and Seventy-Nine Thousand, Seven
- 328. Hundred and Fourteen Dollars and Ninety-Three Cents).
- 329. Q: So, you submitted these to the Office of the President?
- 330. A: Yes.
- 331. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: Can you hand over if you are not using---.
- 332. Q: What happened when you submitted this report?
- 333. A: This was 31st July but after that transaction that we did for the **US\$250, 000** and the
- 334. US\$243, 000 we got a Directive to advise the Bank for change of signature that we should no
- 335. longer be signatories to these Accounts.
- 336. Q: Change of signatories to all your Accounts?

- 337. A: Yes, all our Dollar Accounts where we had these Rentals and Data Sales and Bonus.
- 338. Q: Basically, where you had the 7 million, the Signatories to all those Accounts were
- 339. Changed?
- 340. A: Yes.
- 341. Q: Who became Signatories to the Accounts?
- 342. A: According to the letter we got and in fact the letter we wrote also is for Sheik Professor
- 343. Alhaji Dr. Yahya AJJ Jammeh and Momodou Sabally were to be signatories, that was the
- 344. directive we got.
- 345. Q: You wrote to the bank as the signatories?
- 346. A: Yes.
- 347. Q: You and who?
- 348. A: Myself and Medoune who is the Finance Director.
- 349. Q: Thereafter did you know anything about these Accounts?
- 350. A: No, but because the Accounts were with us and they will know all the transactions but
- 351. Since the Accounts are in our books we will see the transactions later but at the end of the day we
- 352. decided that those transactions should be written off because we do not know what they were
- 353. used for.
- 354. Q: The U\$\$243, 343. 35 you saying that is the last transaction you effected yourself and
- 355. Medoune?
- 356. A: Yes, according to the directives.
- 357. Q: After they had taken over the Accounts did any of your revenue continue to go into the
- 358. Accounts?
- 359. A: Yes, because we had no control over those revenues coming in at the end they have to go
- 360. there.
- 361. Q: All the Rentals went into that Account?
- 362. A: Yes, all the Rentals, Bonus and everything of those monies went into those Accounts.

- 363. Q: What Money did you have left for Operation?
- 364. A: We had the Dalasi Accounts and then after we had a facility with **IDB** and we decided to
- 365. Open also other Dollar Accounts for our operations.
- 366. Q: You had to take a loan facility to continue?
- 367. A: Yes, the facility with **IDB** was government guaranteed facility which we used to buy fuel
- 368. For **NAWEC** and for our own Petroleum problems.
- 369. Q: Fuel for **NAWEC** and?
- 370. A: Our own business.
- 371. Q: To the best of your knowledge do you know how much went into the account, we know
- 372. That you handed over about **US\$7.3million** that was what was left in those accounts?
- 373. A: Yes.
- 374. Q: Apart from that in terms of Rentals do you know what went into the Account between the
- 375. Period you were **MD** and when you left in 2016?
- 376. A: I don't exactly what went there but I know some monies went there. But I can't tell the
- 377. actual figure.
- 378. O: You cannot tell now?
- 379. A: Yes
- 380. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: Well we will call Finance to confirm these Accounts.
- 381. A: Yes.
- 382. Q: I would like you to take a look at the exhibits BB52, this is a statement of account from
- 383. Skye Bank and GT Bank is, ok let's put in these documents first.
- 384. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: Mr. Chairman I am applying to put in the documents submitted by the
- 385. Witness with regards to the **GNPC**, in respect of Executive Directives.
- 386. THE CHAIRMAN: Financial Activities in respect of **GNPC** for the period 17th October 2006
- 387. To 13th August 2013 covering Transfers, Cash withdrawals, loan to PEGEP, Prison
- 388. Rehabilitation, Foreign Currency, Sale and withdrawals concerning various Gambian Banks

- 389. in a bundle, admitted, marked **SC2**.
- 390. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: Thank you Mr. Chairman.
- 391. Q: Mr. Badjie can you go through that statement **BB52** and confirm whether after the
- 392. signatories to the account changed any money was spent on **GNPC**. The Bank Statement of
- **Skye Bank**?
- 394. A: After the Directive, transaction that we did there were other transaction which were not
- 395. done by us because by then our signatories have already been removed from the Bank.
- 396. Q: I understand, my question is they had taken over the operation of the Account was any
- 397. Money in the account spent on **GNPC** business?
- 398. A: No, not my time.
- 399. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: Give him exhibit **BB46**.
- 400. (Exhibits shown to the witness)
- 401. Q: Exhibit **BB46** is in respect of the **Ministry of petroleum** special services account at **GT**
- 402. **Bank**, I would like you to take a look at it. Where you aware of these Accounts?
- 403. A: Yes, I was aware that **Ministry of Petroleum** have opened an Account.
- 404. Q: Did **GNPC** have anything to do with that Account?
- 405. A: The account is for **Training and Resource** and with **Training Resources** we have an
- 406. Interest there because it is something that deals with both the **Ministry** and **GNPC**.
- 407. Q: Do you know what the source of the monies that went into the account is?
- 408. A: If it is the **Training and Resources** then yes, because these are agreements that are in
- 409. Place between the operators and the **Ministry** who signs these licenses for the payment of
- 410. Training and Resources funds on a yearly basis by the licensees.
- 411. O: What are intended for?
- 412. A: It is intended for training of both GNPC and the Ministry of Petroleum capacity building
- 413. Per say and also other stakeholder. And also to resource things like computers when we need
- 414. Them especially for the data room.

- 415. Q: I see, did **GNPC** benefits from these Account?
- 416. A: Yes, we were benefiting before it was opened, when we go for Training and also
- 417. Workshops, Seminars which are organized by Petroleum Companies and so on. Yes, we benefited
- 418. From it and also from the training.
- 419. Q: What about after this Accounts was opened?
- 420. A: After it was opened actually we were not able to get anything from it.
- 421. Q: For the record the **Ministry of Petroleum** is which office?
- 422. A: **Ministry of Petroleum** is the Ministry. We share the same office but they are
- 423. Government Institution.
- 424. Q: Who were the Ministers during the period you were there?
- 425. A: Teneng was there as Minister.
- 426. Q: Teneng Mba Jaiteh?
- 427. A: Yes and Sira Wally Ndow and sometimes the President becomes the Minster also
- 428. Whenever there are no Minister.
- 429. Q: How is it possible for the Ministry to open an Account. Is it proper, is it regular for the
- 430. Ministry to open an account in **Commercial Bank**?
- 431. A: Under normal circumstances, No, it has to be through the **Central Bank** but
- 432. **Commercial Banks** is not normal for **Ministries** to have Accounts with them.
- 433. Q: There is just one more question I have, I want you to look at a document this document
- 434. That I am going to show you and tell me whether you have seen it before?
- 435. (Documents shown to the witness)
- 436. A: Yes, this was during my time at **GNPC**.
- 437. Q: Before we go into the document, was it effected?
- 438. A: Yes, it was effected.
- 439. Q: Tell us about that document, the date and what is the document?
- 440. A: 8th May 2007.

- 441. Q: What is it for?
- 442. A: Purchase of 11 Air Tickets for the members of the Frankie Paul dance band.
- 443. O: Who are these **Frankie Paul dance band**?
- 444. A: I don't know them personally but I know that they were here and it's a band from
- 445. America I think.
- 446. Q: What does the letter say?
- 447. A: The letter says that "I am directed to kindly ask you to finance the air tickets for the
- 448. above-mentioned band due to perform in the Gambia shortly. Because of the 11 tickets is D662,
- 449. 506.10 (Six Hundred and Sixty-Two Thousand, Five Hundred and Six Dalasi and Ten Bututs) the
- 450. amount has to be paid to Future Travel Agency. Please note that you will be refunded by this
- 451. office in due course, we thank you for your cooperation".
- 452. Q: Did the office paid for these tickets?
- 453. A: No.
- 454. Q: You did not pay for this ticket?
- 455. A: No, we paid for the tickets.
- 456. Q: Did you get a refund?
- 457. A: No, we didn't get any refund.
- 458. Q: What are all those loans that you took over as far as you know that you gave evidence
- 459. about, where they paid for?
- 460. A: No, they were not paid.
- 461. Q: Did you make a demand?
- 462. A: Yes, I remember the **Finance Director** making a demand for it but they never paid.
- 463. Q: Medoune Sanyang was a signatory to the Account?
- 464. A: Yes.
- 465. Q: The signatories were changed?
- 466. A: Yes.

- 467. Q: Where you aware of that he was withdrawing any cash from the account on?
- 468. A: No, he cannot withdraw any more cash because he was no more a signatory and he has to
- 469. sign with me to be able to withdraw.
- 470. Q: Where you aware of any authorization he might have been given from the Office of the
- 471. President to withdraw cash?
- 472. A: No, I was not aware.
- 473. Q: You did not withdraw any cash after that from this accounts?
- 474. A: We didn't withdraw anything.
- 475. Q: You had no access?
- 476. A: Yes.
- 477. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: Thank you. Those are the questions I have for you. I hope you did not
- 478. attend the band dance when it came?
- 479. A: No, I did not.
- 480. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: You were not invited as a patron?
- 481. A: No.
- 482. COMMISSIONER GEORGE: Mr. Badjie just a quick question, the loans issued to office of the
- 483. President during your time because the others you said they were before you. Where any loan
- 484. agreement ever issued or any agreement drawn?
- 485. A: No, these were just directives no agreement.
- 486. COMMISSIONER GEORGE: In GNPC's books how was it treated as a loan or what?
- 487. A: We opened an account for them and this was example office of the president we put
- 488. Everything under office of the president. For **PEGEP** we open and account for it so that when the
- 489. Payments are made on their behalf we know where to put them.
- 490. COMMISSIONER GEORGE: It was just like treated as a receivable as debtor but then you
- 491. have mentioned something about something being written off, I didn't get that?
- 492. A: What I said is that when I took over actually to clean up the accounts I recommended to

- 493. The board because those accounts were there and we knew they will not be paid so we decided
- 494. That we write them off.
- 495. COMMISSIONER GEORGE: The other thing on that was the **500, 000** (Five Hundred
- 496. Thousand) withdrawal of cash on the 6th of August, how was that one treated?
- 497. A: It was a letter written to us.
- 498. COMMISSIONER GEORGE: I know it was a directive you mentioned but how was it
- 499. Captioned in your records?
- 500. A: That one was a cash withdrawal and we just withdrew it and paid it to them because that
- 501. was the directive. It was not a loan per say but a directive to say give me this.
- 502. COMMISSIONER GEORGE: Okay.
- 503. COMMISSIONER SAINE: Just a follow up, on the US\$1, 000, 000 (One Million dollar)
- 504. loan to **PEGEP**, where you repaid?
- 505. A: None of those were paid.
- 506. COMMISSIONER SAINE: Under what management approach were you able advance the
- 507. loan?
- 508. A: The **1,000,000** was not my time but it was a Directive that was given at that time for
- 509. them to issue that amount as a loan to **PEGEP**.
- 510. COMMISSIONER SAINE: I am just interested in the process how does it work, do you get a
- 511. board decision?
- 512. A: No, when directives come from the Office of the President you don't wait for the board.
- 513. COMMISSIONER SAINE: You just tell the bank to move the funds?
- 514. A: Yes.
- 515. COMMISSIONER SAINE: It was clear that this is not going to be repaid?
- 516. A: Initially you think it would be paid but as time goes on you realize that it will not.
- 517. COMMISSIONER SAINE: Last question, in terms of the activities of the Ministry of
- 518. Petroleum, we understand that ordinarily they wouldn't open Accounts in Commercial Banks so

- 519. in this case, is it one of the reasons they opened an account is that some of their activity and yours
- 520. overlap, why would you think they needed accounts in Commercial Banks?
- 521. A: I cannot speak on their behalf but I think maybe a Directive too but I do not know why
- 522. they should need that.
- 523. COMMISSIONER SAINE: Let me rephrase, what I try to say is that part of what they did
- 524. ordinarily would that be what you should be doing?
- 525. A: No, as a Ministry I don't think they should have opened a **Current Account** with the
- 526. **Commercial Banks**. That is my view.
- 527. COMMISSIONER SAINE: So, those funds that went to the accounts they opened, could they
- 528. have been assigned to you if they didn't have the accounts or its totally different?
- 529. A: The way it was before they opening of the account it was like this. The Operator will
- 530. handle the money under the payments on a yearly basis the Operator will handle it. The Ministry
- 531. and the Operator will manage the accounts like whenever we are about to travel or the Ministry
- 532. want to travel and they want to use those funds. If they get the approval like the clearance from
- 533. the Office of the President and in writing the clearance they would state that they will use those
- 534. funds. When they do get the approval, they will ask the Operator to pay, so the Operator handling
- 535. it at the beginning. So, later they decided that these funds should come In-Country and that is the
- 536. time they opened these accounts but before it was handle by the Operator and jointly managed by
- 537. the Ministry and the Operator. When we have yearly budget meetings these accounts are
- 538. reviewed, what has been paid, what is the balance and so on. Whatever is the balance there is
- 539. would be carried forward the following year but basically it is funds for Gambia government
- 540. through the Ministry even if the license expire they are supposed to pay those funds.
- 541. COMMISSIONER SAINE: To the **Central Bank**?
- 542. A: Yes, **Central Bank** or to **GNPC** if at all it was right.
- 543. COMMISSIONER SAINE: That is why I asked whether there was an overlap. Thank you
- 544. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: May I apply to have tendered the letter dated 18th May 2007 from Office

- 545. of the President for the purchase of 11 Air Ticket for the member of the Franky Paul band.
- 546. THE CHAIRMAN: Letter dated 18th May 2007 from Office of the President to Managing
- 547. Director **GNPC** directing the purchase of 11 air tickets for the members of Frankie Paul dance
- 548. band totally **D662**, **506** (Six Hundred and Sixty-Two Thousand, Five Hundred and Six dalasi)
- 549. admitted, marked **SC3**.
- 550. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: Thank you Mr. Chairman.
- 551. Q: Mr. Badjie just a point that I omitted, you did have a Board of Directors during all this
- 552. period?
- 553. A: Yes.
- 554. Q: The Chair and Directors?
- 555. A: Until 2014 when the Act was passed, the Chairman of the Board used to be the Secretary
- 556. General, Office of the President.
- 557. Q: Until when?
- 558. A: In fact 2015 when after the Act was passed then we had a new Board.
- 559. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: Then you had a new board.
- 560. A: Yes.
- 561. Q: And the Chairman changed to a member of the Private Sector?
- 562. A: Yes.
- 563. Q: So, in 2014 who was your Chairman?
- 564. A: When we had the Board, it was **Edrissa Jobe** then before him you know Secretary
- 565. Generals change all the time but -
- 566. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: You had, of course many Chairman because of the changing role of
- 567. Secretary General.
- 568. Q: The question I want to ask is when you receive the Directives for the change of signatory,
- 569. normally the signatories to the account would be determined by the board, is that correct or was it
- 570. automatically the **Managing Director** yourself and the **Head of Finance**?

- 571. A: Yes, because we were signatories to the accounts so when we write to the bank they will
- 572. accept the directives.
- 573. Q: I understand but who decides who would be signatories to an account, was it the board
- 574. you will need a board resolution would you not in order to be a signatory to **GNPC** account?
- 575. A: Under normal circumstances yes.
- 576. Q: When you have these directives from the office of the president to change the signatories
- 577. to the account was it brought to the attention of the board?
- 578. A: No.
- 579. Q: It wasn't?
- 580. A: No.
- 581. Q: Was the board aware of it that the signatories had changed?
- 582. A: Yes, after.
- 583. Q: After wards?
- 584. A: Yes.
- 585. Q: But you did not consult them before?
- 586. A: Yes, not before but after.
- 587. Q: Why didn't you consult them before?
- 588. A: When these directives come, they don't give you time and you saw one of the letters I
- 589. read which gave us a dead line so sometimes it's always difficult for you to take certain processes
- 590. in place so you have to act.
- 591. MRS. A. BENSOUDA: Thank you. We may need you to come back all the banks has submitted
- 592. their accounts.
