

## **Georgy Gens' response:**

"On March 20, 2017, in the publication of Novaya Gazeta entitled "Main Beneficiaries of 'Laundromat,'" I was mentioned as one of said beneficiaries. This information does not correspond with reality. I have nothing to do with syphoning billions of dollars from Russia using the so-called "Moldavian Scheme." The first time I learned of the existence of the scheme was from said publication.

I have never had any part in the management of Comptek International Overseas, which was mentioned in the article. I know that it used to sell electronic goods of global brands in Russia, Kazakhstan and other countries. Furthermore, I know that this company was a client of UBS AG, one of the biggest and best banks worldwide, which processed payments related to the supplies of said electronic goods. Therefore, I have to believe that any suspicious payments would have been promptly detected and investigated by the bank and would have been suspended. This has never happened, which means that such payments must have been viewed by the bank as standard business practice. Also, as far as I am aware, the company has never been involved with government contracts.

In connection with the above, I believe that in the article certain accents were incorrect, implicating me in things that I have no connection to.
